SOUTH TEXAS COLLEGE PHYSICAL THERAPIST ASSISTANT PROGRAM FALL 2025 APPLICATION

The South Texas College Physical Therapist Assistant (PTA) Program is a comprehensive two-year program developed in collaboration with local medical facilities to prepare students to become skilled providers of care and valued members of the dynamic and rewarding physical therapy profession.

Applicants should be aware that the role of a Physical Therapist Assistant extends far beyond that of a technician, athletic trainer, or massage therapist. PTAs play a vital role in the healthcare team by delivering hands-on care and contributing to patient recovery and wellness.

This fast-paced program includes a rigorous workload, daily quizzes, weekly skill checks, and frequent examinations. The technical component of the curriculum includes lecture and laboratory courses in physical therapy science and procedures, offered each semester.

PTA courses are traditionally conducted in person at the Dr. Ramiro R. Casso Nursing & Allied Health Campus, located at 1101 E. Vermont Ave., McAllen, TX. However, applicants should note that schedules and instructional formats may be adjusted to comply with any future state, county, or institutional mandates. Should circumstances require, the program may transition to a hybrid or fully online learning environment.

Cohort students are required to purchase textbooks, clinical compliance and preparatory course subscriptions, a laboratory kit, and program uniforms. Additionally, a personal laptop is essential for completing quizzes, exams, activities, and assignments.

Clinical/Practicum experiences are completed during the third and fifth semesters at assigned clinical education sites, which may include hospitals, outpatient centers, and nursing homes throughout the Rio Grande Valley—from Brownsville to Rio Grande City. Practicum schedules are determined by the clinical site and may include early morning, evening, or weekend hours. Students must ensure reliable transportation to fully participate in all program requirements.

Important Dates & Application Information

The application deadline for the Fall 2025 semester is Thursday, May 29, 2025, by 5:00 p.m.

Applicants must meet the minimum admission requirements of South Texas College, the Division of Nursing and Allied Health, and the PTA Program. Applicants who meet these standards will be considered for Phase I of the selection process.

If selected for Phase II, applicants will be expected to participate in additional selection activities scheduled for June 2025. Accepted applicants will then begin immediate onboarding, followed by mandatory Summer Boot Camp and Orientation sessions. Fall-semester classes will begin in August 2025.

Applications that are not complete will NOT BE ACCEPTED.

Selection Criteria/Points:

The PTA Program selection process consists of two phases.

Phase I: The PTA Program selection process is based on a Point System Evaluation. **The following selection criteria are used in Phase I to determine the applicant's points:**

Completed applications will be processed to determine PTA Program Selection Process eligibility. Applicants who do not satisfy all requirements will be notified via email within 30 days.

PHASE II-A

Following submission of a completed application, all qualified applicants will receive an emailed copy of the most recent *PTA Program Manual of Student Standards*. You are to study the Manual *in detail* in preparation for the upcoming timed Phase II-A Selection process assessment, which will take place on **Thursday**, **June 12**, **2025**, from 8:30 to 12:30. You will receive an email with information on where to report to take the exam via Blackboard, earlier that week.

This open-book assessment consists of a random assortment of 70-80 questions concerning the standards and guidelines relevant to all PTA students.

As this is an "open book" assessment, you are expected to utilize a printed copy of the *PTA Program Manual of Student Standards* during the assessment. Multiple attempts are permissible; candidates are allowed to restart from the beginning for additional attempts as needed and as time allows, during the 4-hour testing window. Questions will be randomized for each exam attempt. Please make sure you have current access to Blackboard and Honorlock.

To complete the required online *PTA Program Manual of Student Standards* assessment, applicants will need a laptop computer. I-pads or tablets are not compatible with testing requirements.

NOTE: Applicants who earn the required passing score of 85% on the FIRST ATTEMPT will be assigned three (3) Phase I bonus points.

Applicants who earn the required passing score of 85% within TWO ATTEMPTS will be assigned one (1) Phase I bonus point.

Applicants who are unable to complete this assessment with an 85% or better during the scheduled 4-hour testing period <u>will not be considered for Phase II-B</u> of the PTA Program selection process. There will be no additional opportunity to take the assessment during the 2025 application cycle.

Once APPLICATION (Phase I) POINTS and SELECTION Phase II-A points have been tabulated, the 30-40 applicants with the highest scores will be notified via email and asked to return for Phase II-B. Phase II-B activities will tentatively take place on June 20, 2025 (in-house written assignment and personal interview) at STC's NAH Campus. Individual appointment times will be emailed the week before. Applicants not selected for the second phase will be notified via email within 30 days of the application deadline.

The typical number of new positions available on an annual basis is 20-21. The final number of admissions is dependent on available resources. Applicants will receive a notice via email of their status, i.e., accepted, alternate, or not accepted, by the first week in July of the current year. In the case of tied applicants, finalists will be chosen based on 1) previous acceptance/alternate status and 2) the date of application.

NOTE: The applicant's responsibility is to ensure an appropriate South Texas College student email address is provided to allow for timely notification of application status.

- Applicants who are accepted will have <u>three weeks</u> to purchase a Complio subscription and provide proof of meeting all clinical requirements including immunizations, health/accident insurance, CPR certification, TB testing, cleared criminal background check, and/or evidence of Texas licensure eligibility, negative urine drug/alcohol screen, and all related expenses. (Approximate cost = \$245.00)
- Applicants who are accepted will have <u>three weeks</u> to purchase a Caduceus International Publishing, Inc. subscription to access an online Skills Accelerator preparatory course, to be completed before Orientation. This course is designed to ensure you have the necessary foundational knowledge of the musculoskeletal system and basic medical terminology to facilitate the successful completion of first-semester courses, specifically PTHA 1413 Functional Anatomy. (Approximate cost = \$110.00)
- Applicants who are accepted will have <u>three weeks</u> to place their order for a clinical skills lab packet (approximate cost = \$125.00)
- Applicants who are accepted will have <u>three weeks</u> to place their order for uniform tops and purchase the required uniform bottoms. (Approximate cost = \$125.00)
- Applicants who are accepted will be required to purchase all 1st-semester textbooks <u>before</u> the start of the semester. (Approximate cost = \$575.00)
- Applicants who are accepted will be required to participate in mandatory evening success workshops in July and new student orientation programming in August before the fall start date. Specific dates will be provided upon program acceptance.

The Board of Trustees approved Board Policy (#3337) for all students participating in a Nursing or Allied Health Program clinical course, which **requires all students to pass a criminal background check and meet immunization and medical health requirements before enrolling in a clinical course**. In addition, students participating in the program are subject to periodic "for cause" drug screening. This policy is being implemented to ensure uniform compliance with Joint Commission standards pertaining to Human Resource management and state licensing regulations. Moreover, the public is demanding greater diligence in light of national reports of increasing numbers of medical errors.

Following acceptance to the program, students will be provided with specific procedures for obtaining the prescreening criminal background check and drug test. The student is responsible for the cost of a criminal background check and alcohol and drug test.

Students having questions about this rule should see the NAH Clinical Affairs Specialist, PTA Program Chair, or the Dean of Nursing and Allied Health Division. All consultations are confidential.
