

## SOUTH TEXAS COLLEGE






- Created in 1993 by Texas Senate Bill 251 to serve Hidalgo and Starr Counties
- 6 Campuses (including 1 virtual campus)
   + 2 Higher Education Centers
- Accredited by the Commission on Colleges of SACS to Award Baccalaureate and Associate Degrees
- Offer 121 Degrees and Certificates
- 32,000 Students Attend STC
- Over 14,000 Dual Credit Students
- 6,104 Graduates in 2016-2017:
  - 319 Bachelor Degrees
  - 5,785 Associates and Certificates
    - (972 Dual Credit Students earned an Associate Degree)



# Master Plan Construction Updates Fall 2018

### Phase 1 - \$9.99 Million:

- 19,500K + Education Building \$4.5 Million \*
- JAG Express Drop Off Parking Spaces & Site Dev.- \$1.9 Million
- Skills/Skid Pad Driving Area \$717,529
- 54 Acres Contributed -City of Pharr \$2.5 Million
- 10 Acres Contributed- PSJA -ISD \$370,532




